£500 Bursary Scheme for Young Singers



The Marchington Singers

The Marchington Singers is a mixed voice choir formed in 1984. At full strength we have fifty members. We meet for rehearsals weekly on Wednesday evenings at Marchington Village Hall, Marchington, Uttoxeter ST148LF at 7.30 to 9.30 p.m. We sing a wide variety of music but do not generally perform large choral works - there are other choirs in the region who do that! However, we include music from Musicals to Movies, Gershwyn to Gospel - and most other styles in between.

We sometimes invite guests to perform at our main concert, and have been delighted to have engaged Katherine Jenkins OBE, Lucy Crowe (a former member of The Marchington Singers and now a world famous lyric soprano) and Laura Mvula, to name a few. Other guest performers include music students from Derby High School, professional dancers and, on one memorable occasion, a cèilidh band!

We perform three concerts per year: in Spring, Summer and Christmas; we also sing at weddings and take part in performances for fundraising events such as the Mayor of Burton's Carol Concert, and to support local charities. Our Christmas concert is always a big event, sometimes with costumes and readings, and is very well attended.

All members pay an annual subscription, which pays for our venue and for the music provided; and we have social events such as a Christmas dinner - usually in January! - and a summer picnic. We have a committee, currently of nine members, who are elected at an Annual General Meeting, and they meet regularly to ensure the smooth management of the Singers.

The Bursary Scheme for Young Singers

We are delighted to be in a position to support three bursaries, open to all voices: soprano, contralto, tenor, bass and baritone. The aim is to give monetary support to **singers up to the age of twenty-five**, **whether in full- or part-time education or in employment**, thereby providing the opportunity to sing as a choir member and possibly a soloist at regular rehearsals and at concerts.

Attendance

Successful candidates will be required to attend a minimum of 80% of regular Wednesday rehearsals at Marchington, including any pre-concert rehearsals on performance days. This is to enable the young singer(s) to fully familiarise themselves with the repertoire and engage with other choir members.

It is recognised that a Young Singer may have other commitments such as study time, examinations and sporting fixtures, which are outside of the choir. With this in mind, prior permission should be sought from parents, teachers, or any other interested party *as applicable*.

Bursary Funding

The Bursary runs initially for twelve months at a value of £500 for each Young Singer. If there are less than three successful applicants, the Bursary could be extended beyond twelve months, by arrangement.

There will be a further sum of up to £300 each for out-of-pocket expenses such as travelling. A subscription (normally £50 for members) will not be charged, and digital rehearsal aids (CD or mp3 files) uniform, folders, etc., will be provided by the choir.
